Eco Drama ran a series of CPD webinar sessions from April - June 2021. Glasgow City Council supported Glasgow practitioners to attend the webinar training and also to receive an Out to Play Early Years resource pack. There were also places made available by Eco Drama for early years practitioners from outside of Glasgow.

The aim of the CPD was to share the methodology of Eco Drama's Out to Play approach and to provide tips and strategies for early years practitioners, so they would have the knowledge and confidence to implement the approach in their own early years settings.

GEOGRAPHICAL SPREAD






GENERAL FEEDBACK

After the CPD webinars, all attendees were sent an evaluation form. 66 evaluations were completed.

Attendees were asked, "Would you be interested in attending an in-person CPD session on using drama, storytelling and creative play in early years outdoor learning?"

92% expressed an interest in attending an in-person CPD.






Attendees were asked, "How confident do you now feel in using drama and storytelling as part of your outdoor learning plans?"

Attendees were asked, "Will you use some of these ideas and exercises in your future practice?"


97% said they would.

67% said they found it VERY USEFUL.






MOST USEFUL ASPECTS
